Amendment 1 to the 2023-2026 TIP

This is the first proposed amendment to the brand new 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program. It includes proposed changes to projects in Somersworth, Lee, and Rochester. A public hearing will commence on May 8th and continue till a public hearing at the Policy Committee meeting on May 19th. The proposed changes are included in the attachment below.

2023 Transportation Data Collection Season

2023 Data Snapshot Presentation

1. Introductions

Vice Chair Michael Williams called the meeting to order at 9:05 A.M.

2. Community Updates

3. Action Items

a. Minutes from February 3, 2023 and February 3, 2023

V. Price motioned to approve the February 3, 2023. K. Katrin seconded the motion. A, roll call vote was taken: V, Price, M, Williams, ,W. Lehman, M. Mears, C. Green, M Behrendt, K Kasper voted in the affirmative. W. Watson abstained. The motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

b. Regional Coordinated Transit Plan

C. Lentz gave a summary of the Coordinated Plan and highlighted components of the plan. He explained the plan concerns many forms of "community transportation" in the region. Community transportation refers to all transportation resources in a community that are available to help meet people's mobility needs. These include both public and private services, such as fixed route bus, shuttles for seniors, taxies, vans that churches or community organizations own and operate, and other services.

This plan needs to be in place for entities like COAST to access federal funds for transportation services for older adults and people with disabilities.

The plan is in a public comment period through to the Policy meeting on April 21st.

K. Kasper motioned for TAC to recommend to the Policy Committee to approve the Coordinated Public Transit and Human Services Transportation Plan. V. Price seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken: V, Price, ,M, Williams, ,W. Lehman, M. Mears, C. Green, M Behrendt, K Kasper and W. Watson voted in the affirmative. abstained. The motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

c. 2024-2025 Unified Planning Work Program.

C. Lentz gave a summary of the Unified Planning Work Program. We will submit a final draft to the DOT today and look for approval by the Policy Committee at their next meeting. The

Unified Planning Work Program of the Strafford Metropolitan Planning Organization (Strafford MPO) identifies the planning priorities and work activities that the Metropolitan Planning Organization will address during the two-year program period. The development of the Unified Planning Work Program is required as part of the Continuing, Comprehensive, and Cooperative (3C's) metropolitan planning process and specifically the Metropolitan Planning Rules

K. Kasper motioned for TAC to recommend to the Policy committee to approve the draft UPWP. M. Mears seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken: V, Price, M, Williams, ,W. Lehman, M. Mears, C. Green, M Behrendt, K Kasper and W. Watson voted in the affirmative. abstained. The motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

d. Which candidate Ten Year Plan projects are funded through the regional allocation

C. Lentz stated that a total of seven projects were submitted by municipalities to be considered for inclusion in the Ten-Year Plan. Those projects were ranked according to criteria used by all RPC's and NHDOT. Voting open through to April 14 and a decision must be made at the April TAC and Policy meetings. C. Lentz gave a summary of the projects and the various scenarios for funding.

The group discussed funding opportunities for projects that have not been selected.

K. Katrin motioned for TAC to recommend to the Policy Committee to approve Scenario 2, Somersworth's Main St Complete Streets and Lee's improvements to NH155/George Bennett/Lee Hook Rd, and send those two projects to NHDOT for inclusion into the Ten Year Plan. M. Mears seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken: V, Price, ,M, Williams, ,W. Lehman, M. Mears, C. Green, M Behrendt, K Kasper voted in the affirmative. W. Watson abstained. The motion passed with a unanimous vote in favor.

4. Other Business

M. Williams reported that COAST is circulating a customer survey focused on how to best meet the needs of customers.

5. Citizens Forum

There were no citizens present.

6. Adjourn

Motion and a second to adjourn. All in favor. The meeting adjourned at 10:00 a.m.

The Strafford Regional Planning Commission (SRPC), functioning as the federally mandated Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Strafford Region, is holding a comment period and public hearing for the proposed Amendment #1 to the adopted 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The TIP is a prioritized list of federal and state funded regional transportation projects programmed for the next four years. The amendment is necessary to account for project changes and to maintain consistency with the 2023-2026 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). SRPC is conducting this process in accordance with the Strafford MPO's public involvement procedures and federal and state regulations.

Amendment #1 impacts projects listed in the 2023-2026 TIP which is part of the 2023-2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) for the region. Full amendments to the TIP require a 10-day public comment period, a public hearing, and approval by the Strafford MPO Policy Committee. A 10-day public comment period for this amendment will begin on Monday, May 8, 2023, and will end at the close of business on Thursday, May 18, 2023. A public hearing will be held by the SRPC Policy Committee meeting at 9:00 am on Friday, May 19, 2023. The public is encouraged to submit comments before the end of the business day (5:00 pm) Thursday, May 18, 2023, or at the public hearing at the Strafford MPO Policy Committee meeting at 9:00 am on Friday, May 19, 2023.
