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INTRODUCTION AND FRAMEWORK

<u>Communities for Healthy Aging Transitions (CHAT)</u>, a regional project, examined age-friendliness in Strafford County, as well as Brookfield, Wakefield, Newmarket, Nottingham and Northwood in Carroll and Rockingham counties, respectively. The project was funded by the Tufts Health Plan Foundation and conducted in partnership with Greater Seacoast Community Health (GSCH)'s Strafford County Public Health Network (SCPHN) program.

The project mission was to engage our communities looking at and promoting diverse, equitable, inclusive, livable environments where people can grow and thrive, regardless of age.

To achieve this mission, SRPC and partners at SCPHN designed engagement activities to understand strengths and opportunities in each community, which were framed within <u>AARP's eight</u> <u>domains of livability</u> from its <u>Livable Communities program</u>: Outdoor Spaces and Buildings, Housing. Transportation, Social Participation, Respect and Social Inclusion, Civic Participation and Employment, Communication and Information, and Health Services and Community Support.

The qualitative and quantitative information presented in this Community Assessment was also framed within the eight domains of livability.



CHAT OUTREACH PROCESS

SRPC and partners at SCPHN enacted a modified outreach process due to the pandemic. Most of the outreach for the CHAT project was conducted via online channels as described below.

COMMUNITY ZOOM FORUMS

Residents from across the region were invited to participate in a series of seven municipal or subregional community Zoom forums between February and June 2021. SRPC reached out to each community, but for some an event was not able to be scheduled. A forum was scheduled for Barrington, Northwood, Strafford, and Nottingham on April 19, however, due to the challenges of scheduling such events in the midst of the pandemic and a lack of registered participants, the forum did not take place.

SURVEY

Launched in February 2021, the CHAT online survey was distributed through multiple regional outlets to the residents of Strafford via social media, through the community forum announcements, and between town staff and residents. There was a total of 5 responses from people who live, play, and work in town.

POSTCARD ART ACTIVITY

With the pandemic, SRPC and SCPHN brainstormed creative ways to engage people and give them a different outlet for expressing themselves. SRPC staff designed and printed postcards that prompted individuals to draw (paint, collage, etc.) or write what it means to age as you play, live or work in each community. These were distributed at various Covid-19 vaccine clinics, to the Dover Teen Center, and a variety of other locations.

COMMUNITY PROFILE

Strafford is small, rural, lake community located in Strafford County, NH. Residents report that the schools and proximity to Bow Lake make the town an ideal place to live and have children. The community is warm, close-knit and friendly. Strafford has an extensive network of trails including the Isinglass River Conservation Reserve, and trails within the Strafford Town Forest.

The outreach process, combined with supplementary data analysis, was used to outline the many ways in which Strafford provides an inclusive, welcoming, supportive, and healthy environment for people of all ages, as well as opportunities for improvement. The findings are presented below in relation to each of the eight AARP domains of livability.



- **Hiking** There are close places to hike and walk if you enjoy the outdoors, particularly Blue Job Mountain.
- **Community feel** Many survey respondents moved to Strafford for the feel of the community, noting that it is a nice area and they appreciate the proximity to Bow Lake.



OPPORTUNITIES

- **Parks for recreation** Residents would like more outdoor recreation spaces, noting that many parks are only available at the school.
- **Recreation center** Residents would enjoy having a recreation center and suggested it may be located inside the Town Hall. This would expand opportunities for indoor recreation.

LIVABILITY PRINCIPLE #2 - TRANSPORTATION


"Driving shouldn't be the only way to get around. Pedestrians need sidewalks and safe, crossable streets. Dedicated bicycle lanes benefit nondrivers and drivers alike. Public transit options can range from the large-scale (trains, buses, light rail) to the small (taxis, shuttles or ride share services)."ⁱⁱ

- **Downtown** Downtown sidewalks are an appreciated infrastructure element.
- **Transportation methods** The only method of transportation reported by survey respondents was driving in a car alone. However, the school is helpful when there are transportation barriers for parents and students.
- **Ready Rides** Ready Rides are available in Strafford to assist the elderly and disabled populations in need of transportation for medical care.
- Community Rides "The Alliance for Community Transportation (ACT) offers curb-to-curb non-emergency medical transportation called Community Rides. Community Rides is open to older adults (60+) or individuals with a qualifying disability who live within ACT's 38town service area, which includes Farmington. Trips are provided only to destinations within the 38-town service area as well. Community Rides is meant to serve as a "provider of last resort" for people who aren't eligible for other services such as COAST ADA Paratransit, Portsmouth Senior Transportation, or Rockingham Nutrition & Meals on Wheels Senior Shuttle"ⁱⁱⁱ



OPPORTUNITIES

- **Public transportation** Residents would like to see public transportation through a bus to get out and about.
- Access to services It is difficult for people with transportation barriers to access medical services and the grocery store. Some people mentioned a desire for a food delivery option during times like Covid-19, this may also help to address access issues for those without transportation options. The town may also consider adding a medical clinic or primary care facility in future development considerations, as residents expressed a need for this, and it may be easier for those lacking transportation options to receive services in Town.

LIVABILITY PRINCIPLE #3 - HOUSING

"AARP surveys consistently find that the vast majority of older adults want to reside in their current home or community for as long as possible. Doing so is possible if a home is designed or modified for aging in place, or if a community has housing options that are suitable for differing incomes, ages and life stages."iv

- Housing environment Privacy, quiet, large yards and scenery make living in Strafford ideal.
- Attracting homeowners Many survey respondents chose to settle in Strafford for its school system.




OPPORTUNITIES

- Affordable housing Housing options are not affordable in Town, especially if residents are looking to rent considering most people own homes. Diversifying Strafford's housing stock could help retain residency.
- Senior housing More affordable elderly housing is needed in Strafford.

LIVABILITY PRINCIPLE #4 - SOCIAL PARTICIPATION



- **Sports programs** The sports program merged with Barrington Youth Association in order to accommodate residents' requests for a more competitive program.
- **Church events** Events through the local church such as paint nights and Halloween activities like Trunk or Treat are enjoyed by the community.




OPPORTUNITIES

- **Events** Hosting more community events to bring people together could increase social participation, particularly for seniors who may feel there is a lack of services for their population.
- Age inclusivity The Town should ensure there are events and programs targeted to multiple different age groups.

LIVABILITY PRINCIPLE #5 - RESPECT AND INCLUSION

"Everyone wants to feel valued. Intergenerational gatherings and activities are a great way for young and older people to learn from one another, honor what each has to offer and, at the same time, feel good about themselves."^{vi}

- **Neighborhoods** The neighborhoods in the Town are friendly and people look out for one another.
- **Welcoming community** Residents noted the community was non-judgmental and helpful when needed.



OPPORTUNITIES

- Aging in place Services such as food delivery, housing, and healthcare are needed for older adults.
- Acceptance According to survey responses, there may be an opportunity to cultivate a more accepting atmosphere around peoples' religious and political views.



• **Voter participation** – According to voter registration records and ballots cast in the 2020 election, the voter participation rate in Strafford was about 76%.




OPPORTUNITIES

- Aging and employment Lack of employment opportunities will make growing old difficult in Strafford. When planning for future development, the Town should consider businesses that will bring in employment opportunities for its residents.
- Volunteer opportunities Survey respondents noted that there aren't many volunteer opportunities other than at the school. There may be potential to address the lack of volunteer opportunities and the desire for senior services simultaneously.
- **Traveling for work** Resident suggested that to have a good job, you must travel far out of Strafford.


LIVABILITY PRINCIPLE #7 - COMMUNICATION AND INFORMATION




Q11 How would you rate your internet access in regard to? Please select none if you do not have internet access.

Broadband Access





- **Word of mouth** Sharing information via word of mouth is an effective communication method in Strafford because of the friendly, close-knit community.
- Social media Most residents get their information from social media. The public group, "Town of Strafford, NH Community" has 6,600 members.



OPPORTUNITIES

- **Emergency communication** In the event of a future crisis, text/phone alerts and improved broadband would be beneficial.
- **Variety** Other than Facebook and word of mouth there are limited communication channels, expanding outlets may help to reach a more diverse audience.

LIVABILITY PRINCIPLE #8 - COMMUNITY AND HEALTH SERVICES

"At some point, every person of every age gets hurt, becomes ill or simply needs some help. While it's important that assistance and care be available nearby, it's essential that residents are able to access and afford the services required."^{ix}

- Youth services Strafford School and youth sports are a great asset in Town.
- Use of services According to survey responses, at least 80% of survey respondents use emergency walk-in or clinic services as well as dental care, and 100% of survey respondents use primary care services.



OPPORTUNITIES

- Senior services Residents would like to see services for older adults at the town hall.
- **Medical services and aging** Access to medical services is a concern for those thinking about aging in Strafford. Residents would like to see more doctors' offices on Route 4.
- **Emergency services** In the event of a future crisis, food delivery and a resource center would be a helpful service.

NEXT STEPS

Following completion of the community assessments, SRPC and SCPHN staff will solicit interest from and work with a limited number of communities to develop action plans. Selected municipalities will be able to take the information in the community assessments a step further, to identify specific implementation strategies that respond to the assessment findings and aim to enhance the community's "age-friendliness." Communities will be selected based upon interest and engagement in promoting age friendly communities, local support and willingness to implement recommendations, and geographic diversity. With the goal of adoption, final plans will be presented to each community. There is also the opportunity for completion of one or two pilot projects that will be selected from the action plan recommendations. Lastly, SRPC and SCPHN will publish an extensive resource guide that will be widely distributed via channels appropriate to our key audiences.






Q3 Thinking about the future, which of the following reasons would keep you in your present community? Check all that apply.


Q4 Similarly, what might influence your decision to move out of your present community?







Q8 If you have searched for housing in the last five years, how would you describe the options you found in your price range?


