# SRPC Regional Data Snapshot

This document is a component of the SRPC Regional Data Snapshot.

SRPC conducts region-wide analysis of a number of data metrics each year for different projects and plans. 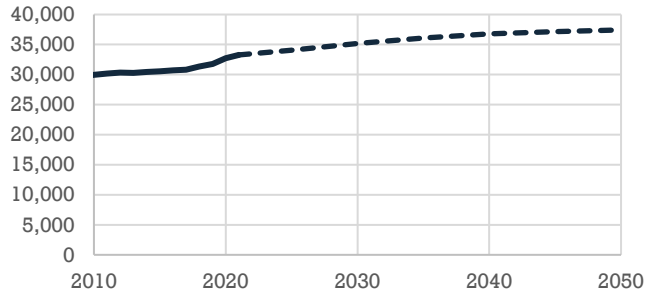
Future editions of the Data Snapshot will include the following changes:

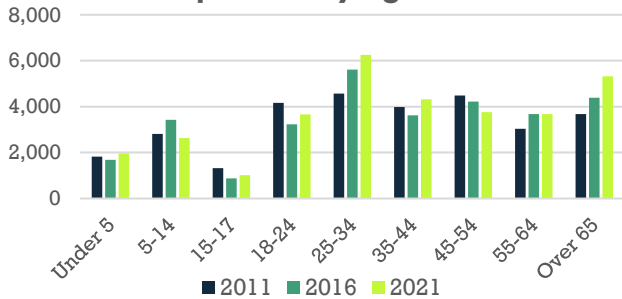

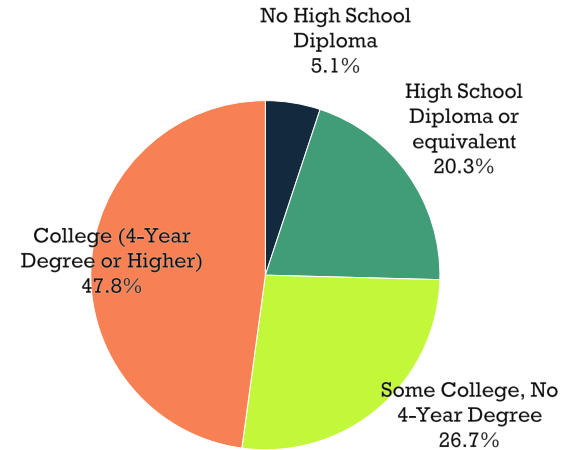

A childcare desert is an area in which the number of children under 5 years old is at least 3 times the capacity of the daycares.

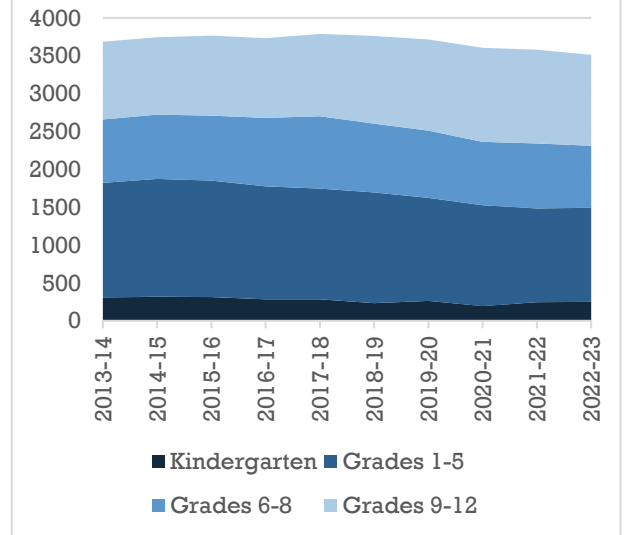

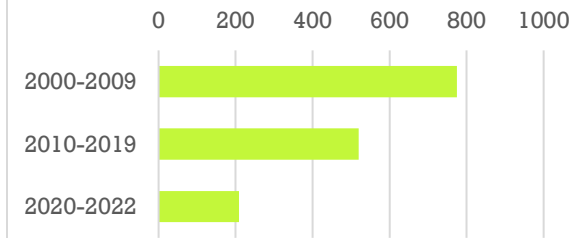

#### Density in Areas Zoned Residential

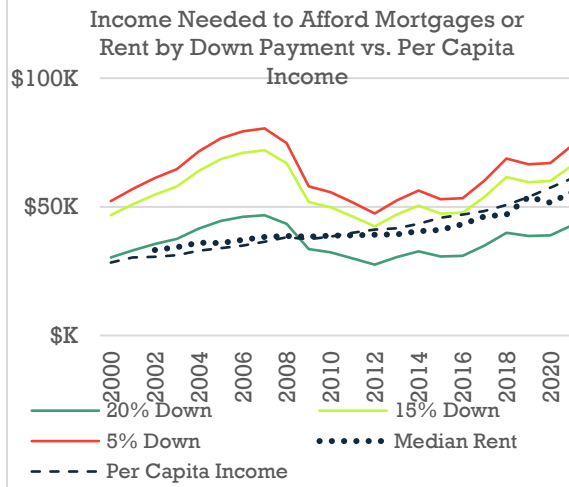

#### Annual Income Needed to Afford Mortgages or Rent (County Level)

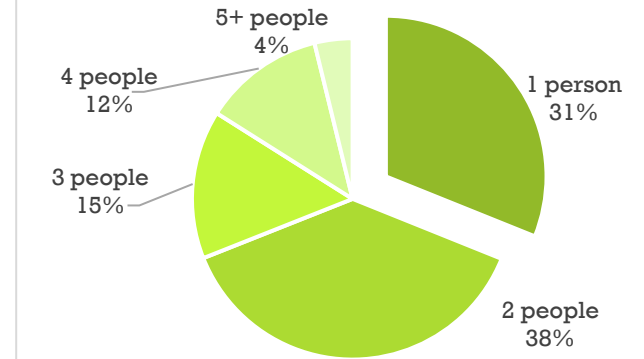
