Project Introduction

Strafford Regional Planning Commission (SRPC) received funding from the New Hampshire Children's Health Foundation (NHCHF) in late 2018 to conduct a project aimed at reducing obesity in children under 5, and their families, in the greater Strafford region. SRPC's approach to this public health challenge was to examine access to recreation in the region. We looked at areas where the population lives in proximity to many recreation sites, and also at those areas where there are gaps and opportunities for increased access.

Phase one of this project was the creation of a recreation data layer and regional spatial analysis, identified in tasks 1 and 2 below:

- Task 1 Update SRPC Recreation Land Data Layer: SRPC will use the Nashua Regional Planning Commission (NRPC) data framework to update and consolidate several existing sources to create an updated recreation facilities GIS data layer. We will work with municipal recreation departments on a QA/QC review of the data layer and to add missing facilities.
- Task 2 Regional GIS Analysis: Using the task 1 data layer, census data, and regional transit route information, SRPC will conduct a spatial analysis of the region's parks and playgrounds' proximity to target groups (such as families with children and living below poverty level) and transportation infrastructure including transit routes.

Phase two of this project was the City of Somersworth pilot project, identified in tasks 3, 4, and 5. SRPC and the City of Somersworth Department of Development Services identified Malley Farm, the Somersworth Riverwalk, and Jules Bisson Park to focus on through the following three tasks:

- Task 3 Somersworth Pilot Analysis of Recreation Accessibility: SRPC will work with Somersworth on a more detailed spatial analysis of recreation accessibility using additional information about sidewalks, trails, pedestrian crossings, bike lanes, handicapped-accessible infrastructure, etc. SRPC will incorporate a recently awarded Federal Highway Administration funded regional bicycle network level-of-stress study.
- Task 4 Pilot Outreach Events: SRPC will work with city leaders on a series of public outreach events to identify gaps in access to active recreation facilities, positive attributes, and models of success. Events will include walking tours of selected facilities, listening sessions, surveys, social media postings, and conversations at recreation department events.
- Task 5 Recreation Accessibility Plan in Somersworth: The final plan will synthesize the spatial analyses and the identified opportunities to improve access to recreation for children under five years old and their families. A guide for city planners and the recreation department will be prepared and distributed. It will identify assets, analyze gaps, and present an implementation plan with actions, timeline, and prospective funding sources.

This "Regional GIS Mapping Analysis Report" focuses on phase one of this project, and aims to identify the mapping analyses used, disclaimers regarding the data sources used in the mapping, and the final

figures and map set displaying our analyses. Communities can use this report to understand areas that present an opportunity to locate future new parks. These types of opportunities can help guide towns in their Master Plans, their recreation policies, and can provide recreation opportunities for as many residents as possible.

Funding Source

New Hampshire Children's Health Foundation (NHCHF) mission is "to improve the health and wellness of New Hampshire's population, with a focus on its most vulnerable children." Strafford Regional Planning Commission's (SRPC) approach in aligning with this mission is to look at access to recreation. The result will be that those who need physical activity, and do not already seek it or enjoy it, can find easier and more visible ways to lead more active and healthier lifestyles.

NHCHF's Strategies for Obesity Prevention

- 1. "Support for establishing and sustaining coalitions or partnerships that result in communities with increased access to healthy food and enhanced places for physical activity, for NH children up to age 5 and their families.
- 2. Support for activities to establish local level policies and practices to promote healthy eating and active living for children up to age 5 and their families.
- 3. Data collection, analysis, communication and advocacy to increase awareness of childhood obesity across New Hampshire for children up to age 5 and build support for state and local policies and practices to prevent childhood obesity."

Methodology of the Regional GIS Mapping Analysis

The regional GIS mapping analysis for this project was executed through Task 1 and Task 2 of this project, as identified below:

Task 1

SRPC created a recreation layer utilizing ESRI ArcMap software, Google Earth, Bing Maps, and the following GIS data layers:

- Conservation Lands (from NH GRANIT)
- Key Destination Points (from NH Department of Environmental Services)
- Recreation Sites (from NH Office of Strategic Initiatives)
- Recreational Trails (from NH Office of Strategic Initiatives, and further developed by SRPC using local data and local knowledge)
- Waterbody Public Access Sites (from NH Office of Strategic Initiatives)
- Other municipal-specific data layers, as available

A "recreation site", for the purposes of this project, was defined as an area, indoors or outdoors, that allows any form of recreational activity, is open to the public, and generally requires no fee to utilize. All sites were vetted for their accessibility to the public, to ensure that every recreation site in our data layer is open to, and accessible to the public. For example, we had determined that many of the conservation lands in the GRANIT Conservation Lands data layer do not functionally provide public access, and these sites were excluded from our data layer. Some exceptions were also made for sites that had small entrance fees, for example, Pawtuckaway State Park and public town beaches require a fee to enter and are included in our data layer.

The recreation data layer was then validated using a variety of methods. All of the site data was given to each of the 18 municipalities in the SRPC region in the form of a map and a spreadsheet. This data was provided to municipal recreation directors, planning boards, and public works department heads, when applicable. SRPC requested that the municipalities review the data we provided for accuracy regarding site accessibility, site amenities, primary use of the site, etc. SRPC also used a quality-assurance and quality-control (QA/QC) process on the data, overlaying all of the recreation sites on top of aerial imagery maps, to confirm that there was indeed a recreation site located everywhere that the data told us there would be a site.

Task 2

SRPC created a series of data analysis figures using Excel spreadsheets and the recreation data layer created in Task 1. SRPC also created a series of spatial analysis maps using ESRI ArcMap software, Google Earth, Bing Maps, and the following data:

- Recreation Sites (the updated GIS data layer created in Task 1)
- Age demographics, poverty demographics, and household point data (obtained and/or created using base data from the American Community Survey (ACS) Census data and downloaded from the American Fact Finder)
- Bus Routes (obtained from the Cooperative Alliance for Seacoast Transportation)
- Recreation sites density data (created by SRPC using ESRI Spatial Analyst GIS Tools)

The data analysis figures and spatial analysis maps were created to display the following themes within the recreation data set: more information on the results can be found in the next section of this report.

- Site characteristics (inventory, amenities, ownership, primary use, and fee)
- Geographical distribution of the recreation sites
- Recreational access and opportunities for various demographics
- Transportation access and opportunities for the recreation sites

Summary of Results of the Regional GIS Mapping Analysis

Site Characteristics

Less than half of the recreation sites in the SRPC region have available on-site restrooms, and less than half of the sites are accessible during all four seasons of the year. Only a quarter of the sites have available on-site water fountains (Figure 1). The cities (Dover, Rochester, and Somersworth) and Durham have the largest number of recreation sites, while the more rural communities have a smaller number of recreation sites (Figure 2 and Map 1).

A large majority of the recreation sites are owned by the municipalities, although about a quarter of the sites are owned by the state, non-profit organizations, or private companies (Figure 3). In all communities, the municipality owns the majority of the available recreation sites, except for Nottingham where the state owns more of the recreation sites than the town. Non-profit organizations and private companies own some amount of recreation land in all 18 SRPC municipalities except for Middleton, New Durham, Nottingham, Rollinsford, and Strafford. Non-profit organizations and private organizations hold the highest number of recreation sites in Dover, Durham, Rochester, and Somersworth (Figure 4).

There are 22 different primary use types of the recreation sites in the SRPC region. The majority of sites are either open space/trails, playgrounds, baseball fields, parks, or multi-purpose fields. Most of these sports fields, parks, and playgrounds are found in the urbanized areas of the SRPC region (Maps 2 and 3), whereas most of the open space and trail networks are found in the more rural areas of the SRPC region (Map 4). There is only one publicly accessible gym and golf course in the region (Figure 5).

Of the recreation sites, only one is primarily designated as a dog park, one primarily designated as a soccer field, two primarily designated as a skatepark, three primarily designated as disc golf courses, and four primarily designated as community gardens (Figure 5). However, more dog parks and community gardens can be found in the 33 recreation sites primarily designated as parks; more soccer fields can be found within the 28 recreation sites primarily designated as multi-purpose fields; more skateparks can be found at the 43 recreation sites primarily designated as playgrounds; and more disc golf courses can be found within the 107 recreation sites primarily designated as open space/trails.


- Figure 1 Number of Recreation Sites and Site Characteristics

More than three-quarters of the recreation sites included in this recreation listing are free to the public (Figure 1). However, all of the community gardens, disc golf courses, pools, skating rinks, and the single golf course and public gym require a small fee. Additionally, most beaches and some boating access points require a small fee (Figure 6).

Geographies

Of all the recreation sites, about half are located in urban areas and half are located in rural areas. Over half of the sites are less than 10 acres in size, and the majority of these sites are located in urbanized areas. Only

about 8% of the sites are greater than 50 acres, and nearly all of these sites are located in rural areas (Figures 7 and 8).

The majority of the households in the SRPC region are located less than a half mile, or within walking distance from the nearest recreation site. Most of these households are located in Somersworth, Rollinsford, Dover, Durham, Newmarket, Northwood, Barrington, and Rochester. Nearly one-third of households in the region are located one mile or further from the nearest recreation site. The majority of these households are located in Wakefield, Middleton, New Durham, Farmington, and Strafford (Figure 10).

Demographics

Considering all of the primary use types of recreation sites in the region and the project funding source objectives, SRPC focuses its analysis on children under five years old will typically be utilizing parks and playgrounds with their families. Neighborhoods in the SRPC region with the highest percentage of the population being under five years old have just one or no parks or playgrounds in their neighborhood. In Rollinsford, Dover, Madbury, Durham, Newmarket, Nottingham, and Milton, the majority of parks and playgrounds are located where about 5% of the population includes children under five years old. In Somersworth, Northwood, Barrington, Rochester, Farmington, and Wakefield, the majority of parks and playgrounds are located in neighborhoods where less than 2.5% of the population is children under five years old (Map 5).

When considering children up to 10 years old, the parks and playgrounds in the SRPC region are more uniformly spread throughout the neighborhoods with the highest percentage of children in this age range (Map 6).

All of the neighborhoods in the SRPC region with the highest percentages of households living below the federal poverty threshold have a park or playground in their neighborhood or very close to their neighborhood (Map 7).

Transportation

Of all the recreation sites in the SRPC region, 296 sites, or 90% of the sites, are within one mile of a major transportation corridor (Map 8). Also, 87% of residences in this region are within one mile of a major transportation corridor. This indicates that most of the recreation sites are easily accessible to most residences in the region, from a transportation perspective, as long as the household owns at least one vehicle.

For those who do not own a vehicle, 141 recreation sites, or 43% of the sites, are within a half mile walk of a public bus stop (Figure 9 and Map 9). Additionally, 31% of households in this region are within a half mile walk of a public bus stop. This indicates that about half of the recreation sites are accessible to one third of the region's residences that are within walking distance of a public bus stop.

Data Disclaimers

Base features are from the NH GRANIT database. Digital data in NH GRANIT represent the efforts of the contributing agencies to record information from the cited source materials. Earth Systems Research Center (ESRC), under contract to the Office of Strategic Initiatives (OSI) and in consultation with cooperating agencies, maintains a continuing program to identify and correct errors in these data. Neither OSI nor ESRC make any claim as to the validity or reliability, or to any implied uses of these data. Data should be used for planning purposes only. Data were derived from various sources and were updated at different timeframes, with varying levels of accuracy.

Half-mile buffer data was created by SRPC. Planning industry standards define the time at which the average person is willing to walk to any given point is approximately 10 minutes, which is equal to a half mile for the average person.

Every recreation site in the data layer has only one "Primary Use" listed. However, a recreation site is often used for multiple different types of recreation. For example, many parks will often include a dog park or a community garden, but the majority of people are using that recreation site for the park area, and thus the site is not categorized as a dog park or a community garden.

Map 2 shows the locations and density of sports fields throughout the region. "Sports Fields" are defined as any recreation site with the following primary uses: baseball fields, basketball courts, soccer fields, and multi-purpose fields.

Maps 5 and 6 show the neighborhoods with higher percentages of the population being children, and the proximity of those neighborhoods to parks and playgrounds. Only recreation sites with the primary use of "park" or "playground" were used in this analysis, as we assume that children under 10, and especially children under 5, will predominantly only be utilizing recreation sites that are parks or playgrounds.

Map 7 shows neighborhoods by the percentage of the households that are below the federal poverty threshold. The federal poverty thresholds for households for 2019 are as follows:

Map 9 shows the location of low-income populations in proximity to parks and playgrounds. The two block groups shown as having a 40% or more of households below the poverty level are located adjacent to the University of New Hampshire (UNH). The census data used in this analysis does include students, and it is our assumption that these two block groups have a high percentage of low-income households due to the high number of UNH students living off-campus.

Figure 8 shows the number of recreation sites by size of the site and location in an urbanized or nonurbanized area. Urbanized areas are defined by the US Census Bureau as "a continuously built-up area with a population of 50,000 or more, comprised of one or more places and the adjacent densely settled surrounding areas." In the SRPC region, the urbanized areas are nearly all of Dover and Somersworth, the majority of Rochester and Newmarket, and small portions of Rollinsford, Durham, Farmington, and Milton.





































Number of Recreation Sites and Site Characteristics




Number of Recreation Sites by Municipality




Number of Recreation Sites by Owner




Number of Recreation Sites by Municipality and Owner




Number of Recreation Sites by Primary Use




Number of Recreation Sites by Primary Use and Fee




Number of Recreation Sites by Size
